According to Civil Service Law, additional credits on examinations are granted to successful candidates who have claimed and established status as disabled or non-disabled veterans as follows:

NON-DISABLED VETERANS:

- 5 Points on Open-Competitive exams
- 2.5 Points on Promotional exams

DISABLED VETERANS:

- 10 Points on Open-Competitive exams
- 5 Points on Promotional exams

These additional credits, which are added to the final score for the examination, may be granted to PASSING CANDIDATES at the time of the establishment of the eligible list. A candidate who is currently in active duty in the military may file for "conditional" credits but will be restricted from certification using the credits until appropriate documentary proof of honorable discharge and dates of service is provided to the Commission. The form necessary for filing for Veterans Credits, however, must be filed with the application . It is the responsibility of the candidate to ensure that all forms are filed timely.

NON-DISABLED VETERANS

In order to be eligible for additional credits as a Non-Disabled Veteran, you must:

- 1. Have service on **ACTIVE DUTY** with the Armed Forces of the United Sates in time of war as defined in accordance with New York State Law as follows: World War II - December 7, 1941 to and including December 31, 1946** US Public Health Service - July 29, 1945 to Sept. 2, 1945 or June 26, 1950 to July 3, 1952 Korean War - June 27, 1950 to and including January 31, 1955** Vietnam - February 28,1961 to and including May 7, 1975 *Lebanon - June 1, 1983-December 1, 1987 *Grenada - October 23, 1983-November 21, 1983 *Panama - December 20, 1989-January 31, 1990 Persian Gulf - August 2, 1990 to the end of such hostilities (not yet determined) *Credit for Lebanon, Grenada, and Panama will be limited to those who received the armed forces expeditionary medal, the navy expeditionary medal, or the marine corps expeditionary medal and your DD-214 must indicate that were awarded this medal.
- 2. Have been honorably discharged or discharged under honorable conditions from such service.
- 3. Submit a legible photocopy of separation papers each time you apply for an examination (DD-214 or NAVPERS-553).

DISABLED VETERANS

In order to be eligible for additional credits as a Disabled Veteran, in additional to meeting the requirements of 1, 2 & 3 listed above, you must complete a separate form and forward to the Regional Office of the US Veterans Administration for verification of your disability. Disabled veterans must have a war-incurred disability of at least 10% certified by the Veterans Administration at the time of application.
