

New - Council Meeting Attendance Requirements

Effective July 15, 2020, City Council meetings will resume being open to the public. Public entry to the building is through the Main Street entrance at top of stairs. ***Face coverings are required to be worn at all times while in the building.**

If handicap access is needed, please report to the rear door at the end of ramp and use phone for security to admit you. Please arrive by 5:30 to allow seating prior to **meeting start time of 6pm sharp.**

If you plan to be a speaker, please arrive by at least 5:30 to sign in and secure a seat.

Per The Governors directive, seating will be limited to 50% capacity. Attendance will be monitored and admittance will be denied if capacity is met. Seating is first come, first serve. No reservations will be taken.

Please be mindful of distancing requirements and use markings on benches as guides for this. Families may group together in a bench.

Please note: Council Chambers is not air conditioned and can become very warm, particularly if there is high attendance. Wearing of face coverings can amplify discomfort. Please consider this if you have any health concerns. Bringing a bottle of water and/or personal fan would be encouraged.

- β Please use the decorum expected speaking before a deliberative assembly in the United States of America.
- β The Chairman will enforce these rules.
